

CALL FOR PAPERS

6th ACM Workshop on Privacy in the Electronic Society
Hilton Alexandria Mark Center, Alexandria, VA, USA – October 29, 2007
Sponsored by ACM SIGSAC – in association with 14th ACM CCS Conference

The need for privacy-aware policies, regulations, and techniques has been widely recognized. This workshop discusses the problems related to privacy in the global interconnected society and their possible solutions. The 2007 Workshop, held in conjunction with the ACM CCS conference, is the fifth in a yearly forum for papers on all the different aspects of privacy in today's electronic society.

The workshop seeks submissions from academia and industry presenting novel research on all theoretical and practical aspects of electronic privacy, as well as experimental studies of fielded systems. We encourage submissions from other communities such as law and business that present these communities' perspectives on technological issues. Topics of interest include, but are not limited to:

anonymity, pseudonymity, and unlinkability	privacy-aware access control	privacy threats
data correlation and leakage attacks	privacy in the digital business	privacy and virtual identity
electronic communication privacy	privacy enhancing technologies	privacy policy enforcement
information dissemination control	privacy policies	privacy and data mining
privacy in health care and public administration	privacy and anonymity on the Web	privacy vs. security
privacy and confidentiality management	privacy in the electronic records	user profiling
personally identifiable information	public records and personal privacy	wireless privacy

Paper submissions Submitted papers must not substantially overlap papers that have been published or that are simultaneously submitted to a journal or a conference with proceedings. Submissions should be at most 15 pages excluding the bibliography and well-marked appendices (using 11-point font and reasonable margins on letter-size paper), and at most 20 pages total. Committee members are not required to read the appendices, and so the paper should be intelligible without them. Like last year, we plan to accept some of the submissions as full papers (15 pages), and we may accept some others as abstracts (3 pages) if they represent novel or interesting work that is not as developed.

Papers must be received by the deadline of **June 3, 2007 (extended to June 10, 2007)** in order to be considered. Notification of acceptance or rejection will be sent to authors by **July 22, 2007**. Authors of accepted papers must guarantee that their paper will be presented at the workshop. Accepted papers will be published by the ACM in a conference proceedings.
